When a prepositional phrase indicates under what conditions something happened, it takes on an adverb's role and answers the question of how. Writing "Jack approached the dog without fear," the phrase "without fear" functions as an adverb describing Jack's approach, according to the University of Ottawa's Writing Centre.

Prepositional phrases always consist of two basic parts at minimum: the object and the preposition. In formal English, prepositions are almost always followed by objects. Adjectives can be placed between the prepositions and objects in prepositional phrases. Prepositional phrases can act as adverbs or adjectives. When they are used as adjectives, they modify nouns and pronouns in the same way single-word adjectives do.

A prepositional phrase is a part of a sentence that consists of one preposition and the object it affects. The object of a prepositional phrase can be either a noun, gerund, or clause. Here's an example of a prepositional phrase (in italics): She caught the bus *on time*.

For prepositions, the sentence does not rely on the prepositional phrase to make sense. A good way to test if something is a preposition is to move the prepositional phrase to the front of the sentence. If it still makes sense, it is a preposition.

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
