Find your local site. Many local councils (and one Registered Social Landlord) are responsible for providing and running Gypsy Traveller sites in their area. Each site has a number of pitches, or spaces, that members of the travelling community can apply to use. These sites must meet minimum standards as set out by the Scottish Government.

Friends, Families and Travellers

Local authorities may be able to identify private Gypsy and Traveller sites in their area by checking their most recent Gypsy and Traveller Accommodation Assessment, details on the Caravan Count website or by speaking with their planning department to establish awareness of sites, or to gather information that is readily available on current planning permission.

Most council and private sites are permanent. Some councils provide transit sites. These are sites where you can only stay for a short period of time, usually up to 3 months. How to apply.
